Our “Almost New” Camp Prayer Book

For the past six weeks, our Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps have been buzzing with the sweet sounds of our kids—the sounds that are true Jewish life. And with this came the introduction of a brand-new camp prayer book that is uniquely Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps. Well, almost. We introduced the body, and over the summer, we’re creating the soul. As Wilshire Boulevard Temple has adopted the new Reform Movement prayer book, *Mishkan T’filah*, our camp and Temple staff members have realized an excellent opportunity to reexamine our camp prayer book and prayer life at camp. Every survey, study, and heart to heart at our menorah overlooking the blue Pacific have proved that Jewish summer camp experience builds and solidifies Jewish identity more than any other single Jewish experience. And we believe a relationship with prayer is fundamental to this identity.

This is not to say we needed a new camp prayer book to accomplish this or that the one we’ve been using for years now was flawed. Rather, this was an opportunity to expand on something already familiar to us. So often in our lives—whether in school, with our jobs, in our relationships—we evolve and

learn. For us as Jews, prayer is no different. And there is no better or safer place to push our comfort level and challenge our perceived limitations than camp!

However, I say it is “almost” a new camp prayer book for a very specific reason. The real creators of our new prayer book are and will be our campers. We are providing the body, meaning the standard prayers, the Hebrew, the transliteration and the translation—all in the style of *Mishkan T’filah*. Our campers will add the soul, meaning the true creativity and interpretation. Right now, the book has quite a bit of empty space and a lack of color. This summer, campers will have the opportunity to fill in the white space with photographs, drawings, paintings and creative writing—artistic expressions of prayer.

We have embarked on a very sacred journey, and I look forward to sharing it with all of you.

Shabbat Nachamu 5769

The Shabbat we celebrate on August 16 has a special name: Shabbat *Nachamu*, the Sabbath of Comfort. It's derived from the haftarah portion for that day which says, "*Nachamu, nachamu ami*—take comfort, take comfort, my people." These are the words of the prophet Isaiah comforting our ancestors, reassuring them that although the Babylonians destroyed the Temple in Jerusalem and exiled them to Babylon, God has not abandoned them.

Why did the ancient rabbis name an entire Shabbat after this haftarah? That's where August 10 comes in—Tishah B'Av, the ninth day of the Hebrew month of Av. On this day, we fast, pray and commemorate our past tragedies: the destruction of the First and Second Temples, the Crusades, the Expulsion from Spain, the destruction of the Warsaw ghetto. The pain of our past returns each Tishah B'Av.

Knowing the sadness this day would leave in its wake, the rabbis named the Shabbat following Tishah B'Av "Shabbat *Nachamu*—the Sabbath of Comfort,"—on which Isaiah reminds us that no matter how deep our ache might be, things will somehow get better. God has not abandoned us. Somehow we'll find joy and laughter again.

It's not easy to help someone we know face the sorrow of losing a job, a marriage, a breast or the life of a loved one. It's not easy to look into their sad eyes and say we're sorry, to listen as they talk or watch as they weep. It's simpler to offer pat answers, distract them or just stay away.

But Isaiah and Shabbat *Nachamu* visit us each year to demand of us something more Jewish. When someone we know faces sadness too profound for words, we hold them as Isaiah would have done, and say as Isaiah would have said: "*Nachamu*, God has not abandoned you. *Nachamu*, we are sorry. *Nachamu*, we remember and we care."

When the Temple Became the Knesset

In 2007, we began a new social justice project to address serious problems in LA through “community organizing.” On Sunday, July 12, Piness Auditorium was overflowing with 800 diverse voices from over 30 institutions, engaging civic leaders to enact important public business.

Our focus was “all about the stimulus.” Research revealed there was no plan to spend the hundreds millions of dollars allocated to Los Angeles and we presented specific ideas to members and representatives of LAUSD, the City Council and the U.S. Congress.

What did we want?

- Expansion of the “Algebra Project,” a pioneering method of teaching higher math necessary to prepare high school students for college and vocational learning.
- Funding for a fourfold increase in workforce development for adults.
- A commitment to get local banks to do their “fair share” by expanding a pilot program in the San Fernando Valley that stems the tide of foreclosures.



What did we get?

YES, YES, YES!

Commitments to all our requests, and as the pictures show, we had an energized audience engaged with civic leaders. Life will improve here, but the work is hardly done.

Want to become a part of our next community organizing effort? Let’s talk and we’ll help you experience how this kind of *tikkun olam* really can repair the world.

JUDSON STUDIOS TOUR SHINES

A LIGHT ON THE ROSE WINDOW

On a sunny morning in mid-June, 45 of our congregants traveled to the world-renowned Judson Studios in Highland Park to preview an early phase of our Temple's renewal, experience some Los Angeles architectural history and enjoy a nosh. Wilshire Boulevard Temple has retained the Judson Studios to repair and renovate the Sanctuary's magnificent art glass Rose Window, and on this Sunday congregants were given a firsthand introduction to the two-year restoration process.

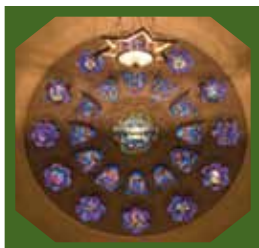
The Judson Studios is located in the Arroyo Seco, nestled in an older neighborhood, up a gravel drive and back in time—to 1910, when the current building was completed. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Craftsman-style building features a river rock foundation, wood shingles and decorative tile and grillwork. After bagels and schmear, coffee and juice, our group was divided into two: one guided by Events Coordinator Anne Leach, and the other by General Manager, Mark Levy.

Following a brisk presentation of the history of the Judson Studios, the groups entered a warren of small workshops and rooms that constitute the studio itself. Winding through rooms and circling around large tables, participants took in the mesmerizing displays of tools, designs, maps, stunning windows, mosaics and thousands of colorful pieces of glass, and were treated to detailed descriptions of the creation and restoration process. In attendance was a multigenerational group, including families with young children and longtime Temple members, as well as Miriam Wolf, beloved widow of the Temple's legendary Rabbi Alfred Wolf. All were awed by the ancient craft.

The pinnacle, of course, was the Rose Window. Before uninstalling and transporting the window to the studio, artisans from Judson created graphite rubbings of the entire piece, took photographs of each section and catalogued every detail in anticipation of its dismantling and restoration. All of these items were on display for the group to see. Now in the studio, each piece of the window's glass is safely stored and brought out in sections for restoration. The lead strips—or “caming”—

that hold the glass together are being replaced, a process by which the old lead is removed, the glass is polished and is finally pieced back together with new lead cames. Because the Rose Window's original caming is a nonstandard size, Judson Studios had to order specially fabricated new caming to match the old. It's a meticulous process, but one clearly undertaken with an incredible expertise.

The tour was delightful, ending with a smiling reluctance from our group and a warm goodbye from Mark Levy, who graciously accepted a multitude of questions that would have continued into the afternoon were it not for a scheduled departure of the shuttle back to the Temple Campus.
