We're in the midst of our Days of Awe, reflecting on and responding to the sacred task of *t'shuvah*, repentance. As if that were not enough—*dayenu!*—there is more we can do on this Yom Kippur.

As we all know, *halachah* (Jewish law) forbids all kinds of labor on Shabbat, even flipping on a light switch, pushing an elevator button or tearing a piece of paper. "Work" on Shabbat is serious business; we're supposed to "cease and desist." Yet, there is one act that trumps every law of Shabbat observance, one situation so important it allows us to do *anything* on this holiest of Jewish days: saving a life.

This year on Yom Kippur, with just a Q-tip® and a quick swab inside your cheek, do the "ultimate mitzvah" by participat-

Midway There: Shabbat Shuvah

The Shabbat Between—that is, the Shabbat between Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur—speaks of the *t'shuvah*: the turning, the changing, the transformation that occurs during these awesome days from Rosh HaShanah to Yom Kippur.

Our tradition speaks of two kinds of *t'shuvah*. Some changes emerge out of fear of punishment or guilt over past deeds. And sometimes we change because of bad circumstances that we don't want to repeat: lost tempers, lost wages, lost relationships. However, *t'shuvah* that emerges out of love transforms and sustains. When we change because we love our children, our parents, our spouses, ourselves, we energize our potential for growth and development.

This change, this *t'shuvah*, is difficult. It takes reaching down into our memories, seeing the flaws, and asking for forgiveness from those we have hurt and from ourselves. The mystical rabbi known as the Ari said, "One who does not cry during the Ten Days of T'shuvah—his soul is not complete." When we cry, it is the sign of a broken heart turned to God for strength, healing and wholeness. The tears open the gates of forgiveness.

L'shanah tovah tikateivu... may we be blessed in the New Year with health and well-being, and may we walk a path of kindness, integrity, justice and peace.

Visit the Ein Hod artists' colony and galleries in Haifa. Speak with Israeli writer, editor and translator Hillel Halkin. Enjoy a culinary experience at Auberge Shulamit in Rosh Pina.

What I know for sure is that Shabbat in Jerusalem is like no other experience. This is how spirituality translates into real life...the vendors selling flowers, the walks on quiet streets, the songs, the prayers, the dinners, the conversations.

What I know for sure is that you will open your heart to Israel in new ways when you join me February 15–23, 2009, for our "Wilshire Boulevard Temple Israel at 60" adventure. See you there!
