In late January we sent a survey home to all Temple members to rate our adult programming and communication efforts. We're happy to report that more than 650 responded to the survey, either online or in print—thank you! Here's a brief overview of the results.

#### ADULT PROGRAMMING

You had a wide variety of suggestions for new adult programming, from family-oriented events to book clubs to programs for young

professionals. Interest was highest in political issues and Jewish history. We're taking these suggestions into consideration as we plan for next year. We're also reevaluating Shabbat service times and event locations.

Events geared toward young professionals or members without children were also highly requested. We're actively moving forward on this and look forward to including these types of events on our schedule soon.

#### COMMUNICATIONS

We were glad to hear almost all our members read the Temple Bulletin at least sometimes (91%), especially since we recently

upgraded its design and content. We've added an online version to our website and e-blasts so members can download a copy.

Just over a third of you visit our website at least sometimes—and we'll be working to increase that number. Remember, all of our events are listed online, and most are available for online registration.

In the survey, we learned that a third of our members prefer e-mail and the website, another third like to be contacted via printed materials and the last third like both methods.

Over the next several months, we'll be using the survey results to help develop a new Temple communications plan. We

want to deliver information you want in a method you can use at a frequency that's convenient for you.

As Rabbi Leder said in the survey cover letter, it was time for the Temple staff to "shut up and listen." We listened, learned and are ready to take action by making vital improvements. Thanks to each of you who responded. Please keep telling us what's on your mind. We're listening.

And we say shalom—hello—to our incoming trustees, congregants who have answered the call to step up and help guide our magnificent congregation.



Brawerman students had an incredible opportunity for a living civics lesson, adding one more link to our growing Israel connection.



# Got Questions? We are Always Searching for Answers!



Tt's been great to visit our many ▲Center for Learning and Engagement groups over the past several weeks as they've explored the myriad facets of our age-old celebration and remembrance of Pesach. We've seen wanderers in the "desert" of the Irmas campus lawn, searching for meaning as well as the afikoman. We've seen Tamar participants and their families making matzah and learning that it really can be baked in less than 18 minutes. We've heard modern interpretations of the four sons, who are still wise, wicked, curious and unsure of even how to ask, let alone behave! Our halls have been filled with voices chanting the Four Questions as our mouths have been filled with matzah, maror, charoset and grape juice.

Each year, our educators wonder how they can put a new spin on Passover, and they always surpass everyone's expectations. This year, we watched high school members of our Beit Midrash tell the *maggid*, the whole story, in less than a minute in ways they had never imagined—one person gave the top 10 details, another added flourishes to the telling, a third mimed the basics and yet another sat at the piano and revealed the truths of Pesach through music. Erez third and fourth graders taught us a great pneumonic way to remember the 10 plagues, and the Eshel kids told us about the items that belong on our seder plates and why. The Human Passover Board Game instructed a new generation of Zayyit participants about teamwork and seder technicalities.

Wherever we looked, whenever we listened, we discover newer plagues, deeper connections to each other and reasons to continue our Jewish journey together as we work toward the miracle of all of God's people living free.
