NEW Nursery School Opening This Fall

ilshire Boulevard Temple is pleased to announce a new arrival: The Erika J. Glazer Nursery School will open in September 2008 at our historic Temple Campus on Wilshire Boulevard! Following in the footsteps of its highly successful sibling, the Mann Family Early Childhood Center (MFECC), the Erika J. Glazer Nursery School will embrace the same philosophy and values that have made MFECC so successful. Parent and Me classes have already begun with continuing enrollment, and applications are now being accepted for the inaugural Nursery School class this fall.

The opening of the Glazer Nursery School is one of the first steps in a multi-year program that will restore and redevelop our landmark Temple Campus.

Carol Bovill, Director of Early Childhood Education for Wilshire Boulevard Temple, will oversee both schools. Beth Weisman will serve as the Parenting Center Site Director and Leslie Cerruti will serve as the Erika J. Glazer Nursery School Site Director. Both programs will incorporate a developmental approach and include a combination of Reggio Emilia, Montessori and High Scope philosophies.

The mission of the Temple's nursery schools is to provide a nurturing environment that offers Jewish values and education to children and their families,

and to offer a place where adults and children can thrive in an atmosphere of friendship, curiosity, self-esteem, Jewish identity, joy and respect.

Parent and Me classes at the Temple Campus provide children from birth to 3 years with an environment where they can experience play as a hands-on experience. Parents have an opportunity to share ideas, develop friendships within our Jewish community and discuss the challenges of raising babies and toddlers with staff who specialize in early child development and education.

Applications are currently being accepted for admission to the Nursery School at the Temple Campus for September 2008. Registration forms for Parenting Center classes are also available. For information, please contact Fredda Loewenstein at

Masking and Unmasking, Masquerading and Disclosing

There is one day in the Jewish year when we masquerade with costumes, makeup and masks. On this day, we follow the path of Esther, who became Queen to King Ahashuerus. Her Uncle Mordecai advised her not to reveal her faith, culture or religious tradition when she wanted to enter palace life. In preparation, Esther completed months of spa treatments, etiquette school and social coaching. She was eager to be selected queen, but didn't reveal "her people or her kindred;" she hid behind her mask.

When "written instructions were dispatched by couriers to all the king's provinces to destroy, massacre and exterminate all the Jews, young and old, children and women, on the 13th day of Adar and to plunder their possessions" (The Book of Esther), Uncle Mordecai delivered this message: "Don't think that you, Esther, of all the Jews, will escape with your life just because you sit in the king's palace... Maybe you are positioned as queen for just this purpose."

Thus, Esther revealed her identity as a Jew, pleading and planning to save her people.

It was courageous of Esther to remove her mask. She was afraid, not only for her people, but for herself. Her cunning use of beauty and sex, her relationship with authority and her ability to hide enabled her to maintain her influence in Persian society.

It's easy to wear a mask, to smile a false smile, to pretend to care. On Purim, we purposely hide ourselves, consciously wearing disguises. The lesson is in knowing when to show your real face, open your eyes and heart, and seek out the truth.

May we always have the courage to remove our mask to allow the possibilities of honesty and openness, compassion and truth. *Chag Purim Sameach*....

When we explore other religions, we learn answers to questions such as "Who is my next-door neighbor?", "What does my child's best friend's family believe in?", "Why does my office mate have that object on her desk?" No people have a greater thirst for knowledge than we do, and now, because of the Center for Religious Inquiry, you can "come home" and explore, engage, encounter—filling your-self with wisdom and understanding as we illuminate Judaism for this City of Angels, all of us on a mutual path to a deeper, all-encompassing peace.

Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps

Overnight Campsite coming soon

E ach summer our camps grow and change. While the basics of camp are enduring—the song sessions, the friendships, the personal growth and the fun—we are always trying to bring new activities to camp that are in keeping with our commitment to provide children with exceptional experiences that foster a deeper sense of Jewish community.

This summer, our camps will be opening a new overnight site that is nestled in the hills of Malibu between Camp Hess Kramer and Gindling Hilltop Camp, with expansive views of the Pacific Ocean. Each night, a different cabin will leave camp and hike to this unique site. Along the way, the group will learn about the natural environment of the Malibu hills, discuss our traditions and views of nature stewardship, and have fun hiking together outside the bustle of camp. Once there, the campers will prepare and cook their own meals over an open fire, engage in team-building exercises and small-group *t'filah* and sleep under the stars. They will hike back to camp the next morning to reengage in camp activities as a stronger cabin unit.





Erika Glazer: Investing in Our Temple's Future

E rika Glazer's earliest memories of
Wilshire Boulevard Temple are of the
sounds of confused murmuring and fluttering pages echoing through the Sanctuary as
congregants tried to follow along with Rabbi
Magnin during High Holy Day services. "Because it was so hot and airless, Rabbi Magnin
would skip around and shorten the prayers
to get through the service faster," she recalls.
"All around me, I heard everyone whispering
and turning pages in a vain attempt to follow along."

So it made perfect sense to Glazer to step forward with a promise of a gift when Rabbi Steve Leder began to talk about restoring the Sanctuary and redeveloping our historic Temple campus. She knew exactly how she wanted to help: to underwrite heating and air conditioning—and build a new nursery school. Thanks to her generosity and vision the Temple will install modern mechanical systems, so in a couple of years, High Holy Days will no longer be celebrated in stifling heat.

From her own experience, Glazer knows how influential a Jewish nursery school can be in forging a Jewish identity. Her own college-age children, Alexandra and Zachary Shabtai, both have strong Jewish identities, nurtured first through a nursery school program at another congregation and then at Wilshire Boulevard Temple's Religious School. "My kids were fortunate that their Jewish education was made relevant and accessible to them," she observes, "and when they both became a bar mitzvah, it wasn't because all of their friends were doing it, but because they knew what it meant and embraced it."

Enrollment has now begun for the Erika J. Glazer Nursery School, opening this September in modular units on the Temple Campus. Its first students—babies and toddlers—can already be seen daily at the parenting classes with their parents in tow.

Glazer's gift to the Temple reflects her passion for education, which drives much of her philanthropy here and in Israel. She has established a scholarship program for young Israelis who have completed their national service requirement. "They earn very little in the IDF and few programs are available for them to continue their education after they leave. So I'm helping students through medical, legal and engineering programs." She also has funded recreational activities on army bases throughout Israel, which are isolated

and afford few leisure activities. So far, she has built four swimming pools that are also used for hydrotherapy.

Glazer, who has business interests in downtown L.A., is also a booster of the urban renaissance unfolding on the city's east side. "The developments downtown are amazing—like the Nokia Theater complex," she observes. A Beverly Hills resident, she prefers to attend services at the Temple campus, despite its lack of amenities. But thanks to her generosity, the grandeur of the Sanctuary will soon be experienced in climate-controlled comfort!




