

## קדוש Kiddush



The קדוש is the blessing was say over wine or grapejuice. The name קדוש comes from the word that means "making holy". This blessing helps us sanctify Shabbat and make it holy. Traditionally, before קדוש is recited we fill our glass to overflowing to thank God for our abundance of blessings. Unlike the simply blessing over the wine, in the Shabbat קדוש we express our joy as we remember two moments acknowledging liberation: when God created the universe and rested on the 7th day and when we were freed from slavery in Egypt.
