Shabbat happens, every Friday night. Why not program your BlackBerry or iPhone with a reminder every Friday at 9:00 a.m.: "Shabbat is tonight. Make it count." Whether you are in Cancun or in your own home, you can remind yourself to make the moment Jewish by reciting the blessings (see below for a link to Shabbat resources), lighting candles and gathering your family close.

While in Napa, buy your wine and set aside a bottle just for Friday night. When you open it, you reconnect with your vacation and keep Shabbat special. Though the annual "Open

That Bottle Night" already occurred in February, it is never too late to make Shabbat the reason to open your special reserve.

While heading to the beach, download Heschel's *The Sabbath*. It is an easy read and is actually quite inspiring. Or try the *Rashi's Daughters* series. Any of these summer reads will steep your mind in Jewish history and philosophy.

Take advantage of your extra time during summer to make a special Shabbat dinner. I personally love the website myjewishlearning.com for Shabbat recipes and other information. Imagine the wafting smells of freshly baked challah turning your home into a summer refuge.

There are many ways that Judaism can join you on your vacation—at the Hollywood Bowl, at the beach, even overseas. When you plan ahead you are more likely to infuse your Friday night and your life with a measure of holiness. When we choose to take Judaism with us, we affirm our life's purpose and context, all twelve months of the year.

The Journey

Mas'ei (Numbers 33:1-36:13)

There is a hike in Malibu I love, not far from our camps. I love it because the first few miles are mundane, ugly even, there's no hint as to what awaits just around the bend. Following the last turn of the trail and up a steep incline is a magnificent view of the ocean. I often wonder how many hikers never make it that far and turn back, thinking the trail is boring, without ever making it to the vista.

This month we read the final chapters of Bamidbar.

The Israelites are making their way closer and closer to their Promised Land. Countless times they almost give up, almost turn back, but continue to move forward. These final *parshiyot* tell of the journey. They set out from place A and camp in place B; set out from place B and camp in place C, and on and on. A thirty-eight year journey through the

wilderness and that's all the Torah has to tell us—geographic locations? Why no details? Why so mundane?

We all know that most of our life is non-dramatic. Days, weeks, months, even years may pass without a pivotal, inspirational, or memorable occasion. Yet we grow and mature as time passes. Our interactions and our experiences shape us into the people we are. The conclusion of Bamidbar reminds us that life is a journey. Meaning does not lie at some high place along the way, but in making the journey step by step.

See It For Yourself

“I had to see it to believe it,” a volunteer at our Westside food pantry at OPCC commented to me a few weeks ago. Empty nesters in the kitchen making sandwiches alongside a soon to be bar mitzvah; Nursery School students smiling at our clients as they hand them a sack lunch and wish them a nice day. The moments that take place each and every week at both our food pantries are remarkable.

Our clients have shared with me that the hardest part about being homeless is not living on the street or going hungry, it's no longer feeling like a human being. Imagine what it must be like to be passed by on the sidewalk daily by hundreds of people who simply do not notice you—to feel like a fire hydrant or a trash can. Perhaps the most valuable thing we offer our clients on a Sunday morning is not the food we serve, but a momentary human interaction. We urge our volunteers not simply to hand a bag to a client but to look them in the eye and say something kind to them, restoring just a little bit of their humanity.

Summer brings with it family vacations, breaks from school, camp, and an entirely different routine for many of us. But as summer takes off, the number of volunteers at both our food pantries always seems to shrink. This summer commit to seeing it for yourself. Spend just one Sunday morning at either of our food pantries, because you have to see it to believe it.

Life Stories Move Us

Life stories move us, challenge us and change us. My Dad's stories of how he left Austria—sketched in pictures and words—shaped him, affected his life and impacted our family. Now they surround my life, and have embraced my experience with Mickey and our boys.

A few years ago a friend said, “I'm tired of reading novels. I want to explore the stories of those who lived life to the fullest, like Picasso, or Eleanor Roosevelt or Winston Churchill.” Yes, biographies and especially autobiographies serve as sources of inspiration.

Everyone has life stories they rarely share. You have stories that you have never captured in writing. Learn to write your stories one page at a time. Recognized throughout the world, *Guided Autobiography*—researched and developed by Dr. James Birren of USC and UCLA—has for over thirty years helped to document life events and transmit them to future generations.

In the fall, two instructors will offer this course at Wilshire Boulevard Temple. Using the Birren method, they will guide participants in exploring themes, and priming questions that evoke memory. No prior writing experience is necessary. This is a way to find meaning and perspective in one's life, and engage with others. Micki Sauer, a longtime Wilshire Boulevard Temple member and professional in the service, entertainment and public library professions, trained in the Birren method and will guide the program along with Francaswell Hyman. Hyman is an award winning film writer, director and producer for television and theater. Guided Autobiography will be one of the courses offered through the Fields Center for Learning and Values.

We met with the representatives of Behrman House, one of the largest publishers of Jewish and Hebrew education text books around. Together, we brainstormed to find new ways to engage students in the digital age and fun ways for them to learn.

We decided to adopt the *Kol Yisrael* series, the first Hebrew program that completely integrates text-based Hebrew lessons with online learning. The program teaches students



to read and understand the blessings and prayers, and allows students to move seamlessly from book to computer-based reinforcement exercises and games. We are excited to offer this dynamic new program to our grades four through seven starting this fall, as it will enhance our students' Hebrew pod study time with fun Hebrew computer games at home.

Rabbi Magnin presided at my brothers’ *b’nei mitzvah* in the Main Sanctuary, and I have wonderful memories of the two years I spent attending classes and services and singing with the choir, as well as attending and having a wonderful time at Camp Hess Kramer.”

Karen received her Master’s degree in Social Welfare at UCLA and began her fundraising career in 1987 at United

Jewish Appeal. This was followed by eleven years with the Los Angeles Jewish Federation as Senior Campaign Associate, where she worked with Young Leadership, with members of the Business & Professional community and with the Women’s Campaign. She also staffed three missions to Israel, particularly meaningful, as she attended high school in Israel. Karen also served as the 6505 Super Sunday Site Director for four years, which she describes as “a great community-building experience.”
