Denial Is Not Only A River In Egypt

Despite photographs, physical evidence and personal stories, Holocaust deniers still exist. However, the German government admits that Hitler and his collaborators carried out genocide against the Jews and continues to pay restitution to Jewish survivors. The Germans have long apologized through financial remuneration, education in their schools and memorials in their streets and parks.

Austria was slower to admit responsibility for participation in the destruction of Jews and Jewish culture. In November, my family took part in a bittersweet witnessing of family and Jewish history in Vienna. My father, Dave Fox, 89, is a Viennese-born artist who was forced to flee Austria in December 1938. He was invited to return with his children and grandchildren to showcase his artwork in the sixth Viennese KlezMORE Festival.

More than 40 silkscreens and etchings were shown at Aktionsradius Wien, two blocks from Dad's childhood home. Aktionsradius Wien is an association at the border of the second and twentieth districts, "Mazzes-Insel" (Matzah's Island), where the majority of the Jews flourished prior to the Holocaust.

This association creates opportunities for dialogue among Jews and Austrians, Israelis and Palestinians, Slovaks and Croatians. It uses music, theater, dance and graphic arts as vehicles for cross-cultural understanding.

Why do we care? We care not simply to honor lives and rich traditions brutally lost or to hear heroic stories, but also to teach tolerance and compassion. As my dad wrote: "My art does not stop egomaniac nuts from grabbing power ... My work does not keep ambitious politicians and generals from starting unjust wars ... If my paintings and prints make you stop for a moment, to look and think and walk on with a smile on your face, it would be enough. To the persons and places unnamed who helped along the long journey from Praterstrasse to Melrose Avenue, 'Thanks, Shalom, Peace.'"

On the eve of Holocaust Memorial Day, Yom HaShoah, may we remember that we Jews came out of Egypt many times, and because of that, we teach tolerance and compassion.

Shabbat HaGadol*

As Passover approaches, many people go into spring cleaning mode—cleaning the carpet, giving away what is no longer used, scrubbing the oven, wiping the refrigerator, putting away everyday dishes and silver. As much as possible we remove the *chameitz* from our lives that puffs us up beyond the boundaries of who we are.

Why? “It is because of what the Lord did for me that day when I went free from the house of bondage, from Egypt.” The Torah instructs us to remember this verse.

As we re-experience the Exodus, we eat only the “*lechem oni*—the poor people’s bread—the matzah.” It’s the dough itself, not that which is expanded through fermentation. We’re humbled by the memory of slavery and of redemption. As we eat only the flat matzah, we guard our inner divine spark, given to each of us at birth, from expansion, enlargement, engorgement. We soberly recall that we began as slaves, not as kings or queens, powerbrokers or landowners.

The mentality of a simple beginning propels us to care for others—those humbled by economics, personal loss or political oppression. So many laws in our tradition emerge to amplify this reality: “You shall not oppress the stranger, for you know the feelings of the stranger, having yourselves been strangers in the land of Egypt.” (Exodus 23:9) “When a stranger resides in your land, you shall not wrong him. The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as one of your citizens, you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord Your God.” (Leviticus 19:33, 34) “Help the poor—do not take interest on loans to the poor because I took you out of Egypt...” (Leviticus 25:35–38)

This Pesach, celebrate the miracle of redemption in your home, and carry it into the world. *Hag Pesach Sameach.*

A Small Idea Takes Root and Grows Beyond Us!

On January 13, one day after the earthquake in Haiti, our group talked about Tu BiSh'vat. We wanted to do an art project, and we wanted to do something that was bigger than just our class. With the help of our art teacher, Jenni Winderlich, who gave us recycled material, wire, cardboard and tubing, we built the "Haitian Tree of Life."

What's special about this project is that it was a process. We built just a foundation: a bare tree trunk and branches with fallen leaves. The students were given the opportunity to bring the tree to life by donating money and writing their names on the leaves. They could then tape their leaves on the tree and help it bloom, creating a beautiful sight.

As the weeks went on and speeches were delivered to various congregants and groups, more and more people became aware

of the tragedy and wanted to participate in our effort.

As we saw it blossom, we realized what an amazing thing we had created to help people who needed our support. We learned that it's not that hard to create something out of nothing, and that helping other people makes us feel good.

Our original goal was to raise \$500. In the end, we not only accomplished our goal, but we exceeded our expectations. We're pleased to share with everyone that we raised \$1,035.26.

The donations so generously provided from our religious school will be sent to the St. Joseph's Home for Boys orphanage in Port au Prince.

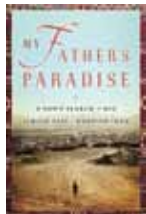

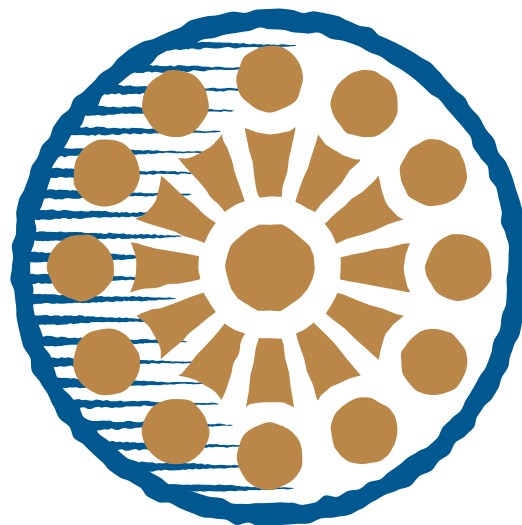
