Close your eyes and remember the songs you love. Remember the time, the place and those present. Remember the feelings you felt and how alive and connected you were; filled with love and a shared purpose – the deep secrets of the world revealed.

Imagine this same experience but shared with thousands. The song is centuries old, deeply embedded in the collective memory; an eternal song, pulsing through the soul, filling the present with the past. The truth is the word, the power is the song. Together with the time, place and those present, it is the memory. It is Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur.

Music has been a central force in shaping the mind and human experience. In his most recent book *The World in Six Songs*, Professor Daniel J. Levitin describes through evolutionary science and musical examples the way our brains, bodies, thoughts and feelings respond to the creation of and participa-


tion in the music experience. Perhaps most importantly, he demonstrates the powerful ways in which music affects entire communities.

Many of our oldest melodies are sung during the High Holy Days, some dating as far back as the 10th century. *Kol Nidrei* likely originated sometime during the late 16th or early 17th century. The texts of our prayers range from biblical times to the present, amended at each new edition. Likewise the music we sing on these Days of Awe has been expanded to include the work of contemporary cantors and composers.

Our great challenge is that in order to achieve a deep and lasting memory of Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur we must know their songs and words. As a community of singers, share these sacred moments with us this new year.

Make the Time to Take the Time Sukkot: Leviticus 23:2

o you ever find yourself saying, "Wow, where did the time go?" or, "I would love to, if I only had the time," or, "There are just not enough hours in the day?" Unfortunately, we are not usually referring to more time for work, email, phone calls, or school work. Rather, we are referring to time with family, friends, spouses and children.

The reality of our modern lives is that we could easily fill each moment with something that "needs" to get done - something for work or school. But the time with those whom we care about and who care about us will never happen without our commitment. If we do not make the time, we will never take the time. During Sukkot we take a break from the normal Torah progression and read from

Leviticus and Numbers. Leviticus 23:2 states, "Speak to the Israelite people and say to them: These are My fixed times, the fixed times of Adonai, which you shall proclaim as sacred occasions." We read this just after the High Holy Days and the promises we have made ourselves, in order to help us remember those promises. Make the time so you will take the time – to be with your family, your friends, your spouse, your children. And make this time sacred. Make it so sacred that no email, phone call or school work can invade it. It is our time to be with the ones we love. And in doing so, it is our time to be with God.



A Reflection from Haiti

t's 9 o'clock at night and the flight attendant has just refilled my glass from her bottle of

Evian. A week ago, I would have thought nothing of it.
A week ago I took the water that I drink, and the water that flows from the faucets in my house, for granted. Tonight, I can only think of the hundreds of people I've met in the last

three days – those whose only water source is a murky, dirty creek that also serves as the village's bathtub and laundry mat.

Clean drinking water – the kind that flows freely from our faucets and that many of us choose not to drink but certainly could – is a luxury that few in Haiti have ever known. Over the past three days our trustee Andy Haas and I distributed over 500 Lifesaver Jerrycans to some of the neediest and most impoverished families in Haiti. The wonder in their eyes and

smiles on their faces when they saw filthy water go into the Jerrycan and come out

crystal clear was amazing.
Thanks to your generosity and support we have provided over 1 million gallons of fresh, clean water to thousands of people in Haiti. Thank you.

This High Holy Day season, as we are inscribed for another

year in the Book of Life, we can be proud of all those whose lives we have ensured with the gift of clean water. *L'shanah Toyah*.

HISTORIC "PRESIDENTS' DINNER" REUNITES EIGHT TEMPLE LEADERS



Twenty-three years of Wilshire Boulevard Temple leadership were represented at the Presidents' Dinner, a recent event that reunited eight presidents and their spouses. In attendance were: Terry and Lionel Bell (1987-1991); Lily

Tartikoff and Bruce Karatz (1994-1997); Bunny Wasser and Howard Bernstein (1994-1997); Christina and Mark Siegel (1997-2000); Susan and Don Schwarz (2000-2003); Makiko and Bruce Friedman (2003-2006); Julie Miller (2006-2009) and Marc Binenfeld, and Dana and Richard Pachulski (2009-present). Also in attendance were Betsy and Rabbi Steve Leder and architect Brenda Levin and her husband, David Abel.

Hosted by Julie Miller,

Rich Pachulski and Bruce Karatz, the dinner provided an opportunity for the Temple's leadership to hear a detailed presentation from Brenda Levin and Rabbi Leder about the progress of the Building Lives project. It marked the first time in memory that all past presidents had come together on behalf of the Temple they served so well. The presidents viewed conceptual drawings of the project and learned many of the details about the project's phasing and design.

Rabbi Leder gave a fundraising update and spoke of the generosity of the congregants who have supported the project. All warmly reminisced about their years on the Board of Trustees and the Temple they all love so dearly. An additional million dollars was pledged as a result of the Presidents' Dinner.

In its 148-year history, the Temple has had 22 presidents, many of whom played important roles in the civic and business life of Los Angeles. Joseph Newmark, the first president, took office in 1862 after serving as the city's first

kosher butcher and then the rabbi of the nascent congregation B'nai Brith. He was succeeded in 1872 by Isaias W. Hellman, who helped bring the Southern Pacific Railroad to Los Angeles and whose banking enterprises ultimately became the Wells Fargo Bank. Hellman's life was chronicled in a 2008 biography called *Towers of Gold: How One Jewish Immigrant Named Isaias Hellman Created California*. Harris Newmark (1881-1885),

who succeeded Hellman, was a founder of the L.A. Public Library, the Chamber of Commerce and laid out the city of Montebello. In 1900, Kaspare Cohn took office as president and led the congregation for 10 years. He was a business partner of Harris Newmark and a philanthropist who founded the predecessor organizations that grew to become the City of Hope and the Jewish Federation.

The Temple's rich history and stature as one of our city's most important religious institutions is due in no small measure to the leadership from the 19th century to the 21st. We are grateful to our past presidents for their ongoing commitment and support for our vibrant future through the Building Lives Project.
