Parashat Vayechi Genesis 47:28-50:26

s Jacob is dying, he whispers to each of his sons about their character and future. It's his last chance to guide them through life.

Jews are taught to leave more than objects to our children; we're taught to leave words. Nonmaterial inheritance, called an ethical will, began informally almost 4,000 years ago with Jacob, recounted in this week's Torah portion. Formal ethical wills date back to 11th-century Europe.

We spend so much time acquiring wealth and possessions to bequeath to our children. Why not also follow Jacob's example and leave a written account of the values we hope they inherit? I offer mine as a humble example.

Use this as a starting place or start from scratch, but write one. Your children will need your wisdom and words more than anything else you can leave them.

Dear Aaron and Hannah,

I want you to know that you and your mother are the joys of my life; all other accomplishments pale. I want you to always be good Jews because then I know you'll be good, charitable, loving, disciplined, decent people.

Live more for today than tomorrow. Be forgiving to a fault. When you do something, do your very best. Tell many jokes. Always try to have enough money so you'll never be afraid of someone else's power over you. But use your money to help the powerless.

Never pick a fight. But if someone picks one with you, don't back down. If you've done good for someone, see it as a small thing. If someone has done you wrong, see that as a small thing, too.

See the world, dance and give. Let good food, warm bread and wine grace your table. Study Torah diligently. Be welcome in each other's homes. Light a yahrzeit candle for Mommy and me when we're gone. Most of all, remember how deeply and eternally I love you.

The world hates the Jews. The world always has and will continue to do so." So says celebrated playwright and novelist David Mamet in this new entry in the Jewish Encounters series as he sets his sights on both anti-Semites and apostate Jews, whom he refers to as "the Wicked Sons." Mamet marshals his passion and mastery of language to argue that only religious observance is an authentic, non-self-hating expression of Judaism.


